What is the Pupil Premium or Pupil Premium +?

The Pupil Premium and Pupil Premium + is additional funding from the Government that is used to help to raise the attainment of eligible children. A school can decide how to use the funding to support the children's individual needs. This could be through the use of additional learning support for a child, staff training or wider support for a child that extends beyond the curriculum. Schools must publish details on how the pupil premium funding has been allocated, and the effect this has had on the progress and attainment of the pupils who attract the funding. These reports can be found on the school website or are available on request from the school office.

Who is eligible for Pupil Premium +?

- Children who are Looked After and are in Local Authority Care
- Children who have been adopted from care
- Children who have left care under a special guardianship order or residence order

Who *may* be eligible for the Pupil Premium

- Children who are currently eligible for benefits related free school meals
- Children who were eligible for benefits related free school meals in the past 6 years
- Children whose parents are serving members of the armed forces
- Families who are in receipt of:
 - ⇒ Income Support
 - ⇒ Child Tax Credit (providing not in receipt of Working Tax Credit and do not have an annual income which exceeds £16, 190)
 - ⇒ Income based Job Seekers Allowance
 - ⇒ Income related Employment Support Allowance
 - ⇒ Guaranteed element of state pension credit
 - ⇒ Universal credit with an income less than £7, 400 a year
 - ⇒ Support under part IV of the Immigration and Asylum act
 - ⇒ Families with no recourse to public funds
