Key Knowledge

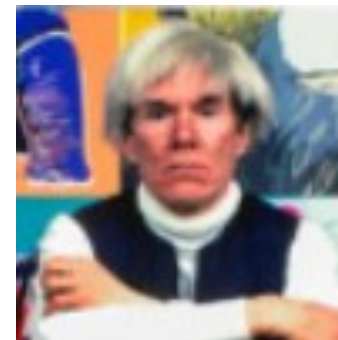
Drawing from observation means to draw what you can see. It is important to look carefully at shapes, line, textures
