Prior Learning

To know artists can make art in different ways .

Identify techniques that have been used to create a piece of artwork.

To identify simple differences between works of art within and across disciplines e.g. subject/colour.

Key Knowledge

Piet Mondrian is a famous artist who created pieces of work using bold, black lines to create squares and rectangles.

To identify techniques used by the artists and understand that these can be used to create their own piece of art.

Children will be able to evaluate their own and others work and compare it to Piet Mondrian's thinking about the similarities and differences.

Key Vocabulary

Artist– A person who creates art.

Abstract– A picture created in a form which isn't realistic.

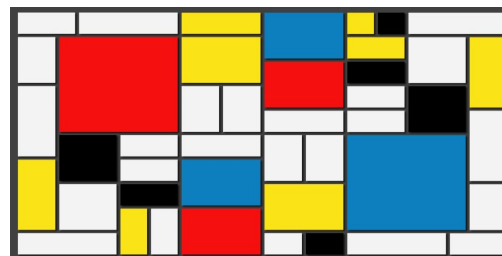
Pattern– A design where colours and lines are repeated.

Primary colours– Red, blue and yellow.

Cubism– Artwork made using different shapes.

Size- the relationship between the area occupied by one shape to that of the area oc-
